# Ronnie 'Apache' Fredrick Clark

MAR 21, 1962 - APR 10, 2020

**R**onnie "Apache" Fredrick Clark, age 58 of Knoxville, Iowa, formerly of both Centerville and Davenport, passed away Friday, April 10, 2020 at the Kavanagh House in Des Moines.

He was born March 21, 1962, in Iowa City, Iowa, the son of Ernest and Carolyn (Hoke) Clark. In his formative years, Ronnie lived in Davenport, Iowa, where he attended HM Perry Elementary School and later, Frank L. Smart Junior High School. His family relocated to Centerville, where he then attended Centerville Schools.

Ronnie was employed with Country Village Animal Clinic in Centerville for eight years. He later worked with Victoria Rosencrants in Centerville training horses over a four-year period of time.
